New at the Library:

Library Facelift: Visit the nearly completed 2nd floor during our open house April 16th from 3pm-5pm and see a preview of what will be coming for the 1st floor next August.

The renovation of the 1st floor is scheduled to begin May 12, 2008. The first floor will be closed except for a corridor from the front doors to the elevators. Circulation services will be offered in that corridor and reference services will move to the 2nd floor.

Additional computers and copier/printers will be added to the upper floors.

NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK

The Dulaney-Browne Library staff is organizing a celebration in the library April 13-19 as part of National Library Week. We are planning special events including an open house for the newly remodeled 2nd floor, contests with lots of prizes, and free popcorn. In addition, we will be sponsoring a food drive for Skyline Urban Ministries.

National Library Week was created by a group formed by the American Library Association and the American Book Publishers and first celebrated in 1958. The concerns that motivated these individuals fifty years ago seem even larger in today's world. They were concerned with a decline in reading and hoped to en-

courage more reading and library use. Reading and libraries have changed a great deal in the last 50 years, but the need to encourage people to use the resources available in their local libraries continues.

Come by the Dulaney-Browne Library during National Library Week, not just for the free food and prizes, but also to find out the new spaces and resources that are now available or coming soon.

New spaces include the recently remodeled second floor, including the Center for Excellence in Teaching and Learning, the Fine Arts Institute, and the Center for Interpersonal Studies through
