Oklahoma City University has a limited number of competitive academic scholarships available to any senior high school student who desires to major in a field of science. This scholarship is named in honor of Dr. Frank G. Brooks, and is a competitive, full-tuition scholarship that will be awarded to an outstanding Oklahoma science student who chooses to attend Oklahoma City University.

Oklahoma City University is home to the Alpha chapter of Beta Beta Beta Biological Honor Society (TriBeta). This organization was founded at Oklahoma City University in 1922 by Dr. Brooks and a group of his students. A national organization, TriBeta now has more than 400 chapters.

This award cannot be combined with any other university scholarships.

The Frank Brooks Scholarship selection committee will assess multiple criteria, including but not limited to ACT/SAT score and grade point average. An on-campus interview will be scheduled with selected applicants. Priority scholarship application deadline is March 1, annually with notifications being made by March 31, annually.
