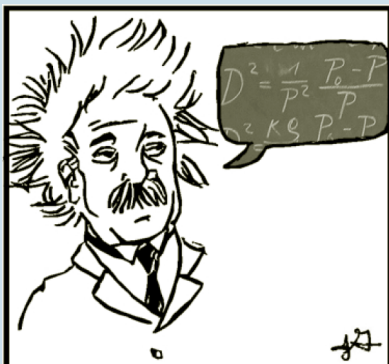

### **LASHER by Anne Rice**
