<sup>2</sup> All incoming freshmen and transfer students with 45 credit hours or less are required to take the liberal arts seminar. Transfer students may petition that previous coursework count toward the requirement. Transfer students with more the 45 credit hours must take an additional 3 credit hrs course from the College of Arts and Sciences in consultation with advisor.
